

Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live."

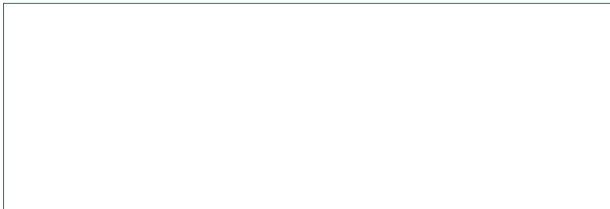
